## What You Can Expect

- Our knowledgeable and accommodating staff will guide you throughout you and your child's experience at our Center.
- Your child will receive comprehensive developmental testing by a Ph.D. level psychologist. The psychologist will test your child's language and cognitive functioning, social skills, and also his or her levels of everyday skills needed to function and meet the demands of the environment.
- At the end of your visit, the psychologist will review your child's performance on standardized tests with you and answer your questions.
- Your child will receive a small prize at the end of the visit.
- We will monitor your child's progress periodically until he or she turns three.

## What Are The Benefits?

- Free developmental evaluations and private consultation to explain test results.
- Written reports with your child's test scores and description of his or her performance.
- Referral to the appropriate agency for treatment if your child is showing a possible delay.
- Free monitoring of your child's development until age three.
