You and your child can help SARRC develop effective preschool programs that benefit children with and without autism spectrum disorder.

Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center is studying how early childhood education experiences affect the development of preschoolers with and without autism spectrum disorder, in order to develop effective early childhood intervention programs.

You will receive compensation for your participation at each study visit.



We are recruiting children between 18 and 60 months of age and their parent(s). You may be eligible to participate if:

- Your child has been diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD).
- Your child has been classified as at-risk for ASD by a healthcare professional.
- Your child is typically developing.

Your child does not need to be enrolled in preschool to participate. Participation in this study includes up to 6 study visits depending on your child's age at enrollment in the study. Each study visit will last 3-4 hours. Study visits will be spaced 6 to 12 months apart until your child starts kindergarten.

Study visits involve:

- Providing information about your child's development, daytime setting, and services.
- Playing games with your child.
- Your child playing games that assess learning, communication and social development.
