

Now Enrolling: Investigational Study of Marijuana-Based Medication for Anxiety in adults with Autism

Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center (SARRC) is currently enrolling adults ages 18-45 years old who have a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) to participate in a clinical trial designed to evaluate the safety and efficacy of a marijuana based oral solution compared to placebo in treating anxiety symptoms in adults with ASD.

STUDY SNAPSHOT

- Participant will receive Marijuana based investigational oral solution or placebo.
- All study-related care, tests and study procedures will be provided to participants at no cost.
- Participant and the study partner will receive \$50 for in-person visits and can earn up to \$350 each by completing all 7 inperson study visits.
- Note: Investigational medication's CBD:THC ratio is 23:1 (THC is responsible for the euphoric sensation associated with marijuana)

STUDY PARTICIPATION WILL INVOLVE

- (7) in-person visits at our campus
- (4) phone calls visits lasting 5-10 minutes
